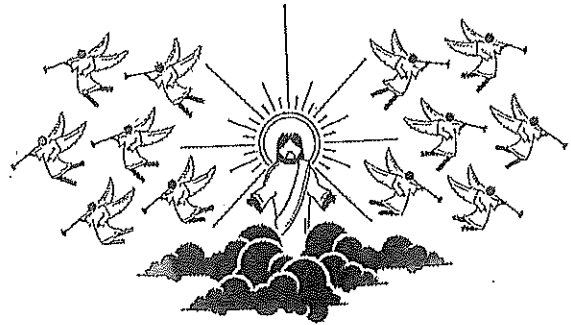

Reflection for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time
