Reflection for the 23rd Sunday

in Ordinary Time... *Like an angel in the Gospels, whose first words are invariably, "Do not be afraid," Isaiah begins this passage with the simple words, "Fear not!" to all "whose hearts are frightened" (Isaiah 35:4). These are not just idle words. Though this chapter of Isaiah may have been written later than the passages around it, it was placed here in the midst of Israel's fall and Judah's capitulation to Assyria. The people of Judah sorely needed words of hope. Often so do we. Amidst the tumult of current events, it is comforting to hear that the Lord's first message is "Be strong, fear not!"*

Prayer for Priests... *Oh, Jesus, Eternal Father, look down with love upon Thy priests. Fill them with burning zeal for the conversion of sinners. Keep them within the shelter of Thy Sacred Heart. Keep unstained their anointed hands which daily touch Thy Sacred Body. Keep unsullied their purple lips with Thy Precious Blood. Keep pure and unearthly thier hearts sealed with the sublime marks of Thy glorious Priesthood. Let Thy holy love protect them from the world's contagion. Bless their labors with abundant fruit, and may the souls to whom they minister on earth be one day their joy and consolation in heaven. Amen.*
