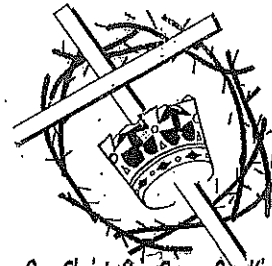

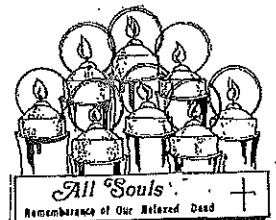

### Reflection - Christ the King Sunday

The solemnity of Christ the King is celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year (a week before Advent). Pope Pius XI instituted the Solemnity in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* because he was concerned about the response of growing Secularism and saw the attempt to "thrust Jesus Christ and His holy law" out of public life, so he responded with the Christ the King Sunday. This solemnity reminds the faithful that Christ reigns as King of the Universe, and it encourages Catholics to respond to this reality.

# *Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program*

## *The Story of the Silver Rose*

Our Lady of Guadalupe has done so much for her people in Mexico that the Columbian Squires in Monterrey, Mexico, wanted to give something back. They came up with the idea of running a rose to Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey. They invited other squires from other countries on the North American Continent to participate—from Laredo, Texas to London, Ontario, Canada. The London squires asked to start the relay running through the United States and finishing up in Mexico.

The first rose was a natural rose. The squires wanted to make yet another run in 1961, but due to the condition of the rose, it could not be used again. Grand Knight Arthur Mount, Rev. Edward Garfield and Bishop Cody then decided to make a bronze rose and sent it to Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

When some of the squires heard about the bronze rose, they decided to call upon a jeweler, Brother Miguel Martinez Montoya, to make a silver rose because silver is one of Mexico's precious metals.

The jeweler saw a beautiful bed of roses in a garden of a woman in the village. He asked if he could have a rose as a model for the making of the Silver Rose. She gladly gave him the rose and the stem to which it was attached. Subsequently, Mr. Montoya made all the Silver Roses from 1961—1997.

The first Silver Rose was blessed by Bishop Alfonso Espino Silva. This rose was sent to the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Office.

From 1961 until the early 1990s, the Knights from Mexico, Texas and the Our Lady of Guadalupe Province of the Fourth Degree kept the Silver Rose tradition alive. In the 1990s, the Knights decided to make the Silver Rose a Supreme Council Program. The first effort consisted of one route carrying a Silver Rose from London through the Central U.S. to Texas for transfer to Mexico. Soon there were three Silver Rose routes.

In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson shaped the program as a *culture of life effort* at the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. The annual effort "is a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus," said Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Since March, 2018, there are eight (8) Silver Roses.
