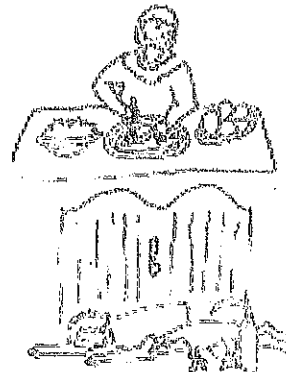

*Reflection for the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Too late!! While he was alive, the rich man in today's Gospel ignored the beggar Lazarus at his gate. He even knew his name. Now he suffers in torment. He chose not to see Lazarus. He chose to be blind to his needs, not even dumping table scraps from his table outside his gate for him to eat. It is too late for this man who spent his life taking care of only himself and ignoring others in need.

At the end of the parable, Abraham dismisses the rich man's pleas to send the deceased Lazarus to warn his brothers, saying that "neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead."

But it is not too late for us. No matter our age, we can change our attitudes and behavior. As the seasons change around us, let us consider the possibility of change within us.

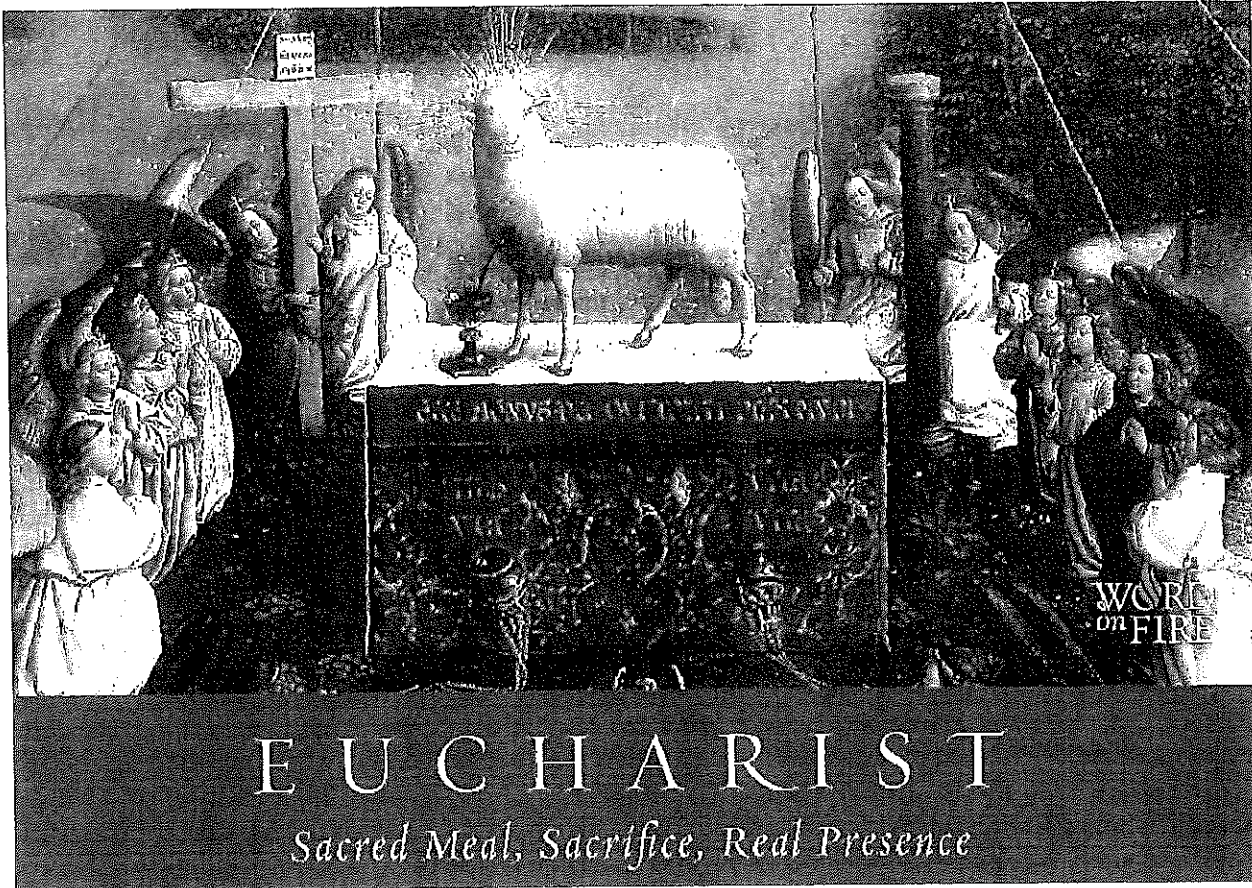

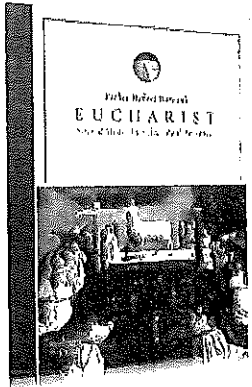
**Rosary Around the Lake**
